Introduction and Methods

Experiment

- Introduce non-mutual friends to Elliot through social media and to Spencer in person.
- Survey their reactions and perceptions.
- Goals

-How does the increased use of social media impact our perceptions of others?

-How do these perceptions affect social interaction in real life?

INITIAL SURVEY QUESTIONS

- U What is the general vibe you get from this person?
- Based on their profiles, name three things they might bring up in conversation.
- How much does he use social media? Do you predict him to have all the most popular social media outlets like Instagram, Snapchat, etc.?
- How much does he use the internet for non-school related things?
- What socioeconomic background would you guess they are from?
- □ Would you be friends with them?

- □ How often does he go out?
- □ What's his sex life like?
- □ What parts of his life do you envy?
- □ For example, what's a skill you think he might possess that you don't have?
- Based on their profile, what would you say are this person's defining characteristics?
- □ What are their interests?
- How accurate do you think your first impression will be?

POST EXPERIMENT QUESTIONS

- How do you think your reactions between Elliot and Spencer differed?
- Do you think having "seen" Elliot on social media beforehand influenced your interactions between one another?
- Do you feel that because you had previous knowledge of Elliot, it was difficult or easier to carry out conversation?
- Has this experiment led you to question your own assumptions of others on social media?
- Describe how your impression changed or remained constant throughout
- How accurate were your survey responses?
- Do you feel like you enter real-life interactions with predispositions based on media profiles?



Preliminary Responses

- Funny sense of humor
- Personable and easy going
- Upper middle class, but not eager to show off possessions
- Envious of Elliot's ability to play football
- Expected his first impression to remain accurate when he met him

Connor Kennedy (cont.)

Post-experiment responses

- -Conversation with Elliot felt generic and forced
- -First impression of Elliot was "hit or miss"
- -Felt good about initial interpretation of Elliot's character, thought they would have more in common
- -Had a more "real" conversation with Spencer
- -Surprised at how easily the conversation flowed from topic to topic with Spencer

- "Seems to have good vibes"
- Interested in sports, humor, family
- Moderate Social Media use
- Average/Middle-class background
- Wouldn't be opposed to being friends

- Unsure of the accuracy of his impressions from social media

Liam (cont.)

<u>Post-Experiment Responses</u> (After meeting Spencer & Elliot):

- No preconceived notions of Spencer, but did of Elliot.
- Meeting wasn't heavily influenced, but the dynamic of conversation changed a bit
- Possibly more difficult to carry out conversation
- Not huge on social media, so doesn't judge people unless he knows them
- Thinks social media is somewhat destructive
- Doesn't normally meet people online before in-person

- He seems like a cool dude,

- Parties a lot, confident
- Feels like she'll be accurate but fears quick judgement

Sydney (cont.)

Post-Experiment Responses

- Very different reaction; convo with Elliot felt awkward, didn' t expect him to be quiet
- Thought Elliot was a "frat star"
- Basing judgments off of social media is no way to measure personality
- "Assumptions are more aligned with reality the more you know a person, but they seem to be different at the first meeting"

Cass Anderson



Year: Freshman Born: Ashland, OR Social Media: Facebook and Snapchat

Preliminary Responses:

- Seems pretty chill, probably likes to party.
- Interested in sports, partying, and friends.
- Is fairly active on social media
- Feels like her responses will be somewhat accurate.



Post Experiment Responses:

- Elliot was more closed off than expected.
- Thinks it is beneficial to go in with an open mind during first meetings.
- Felt her predictions were fairly accurate.
- "I think it depends on the person. If they are really active on facebook it is easier to create predispositions about them."

Test Subject Reaction

<u>Elliot</u>

- Going into the meetings, I had very little knowledge as to who I was meeting with
- This created a rare situation in which I met someone without first observing their social media
- One could argue, I am so use to knowing someone's "social side," that without knowing this social side, I become awkward when thrown into conversations with these people

<u>Spencer</u>

- Conversations felt pretty organic; nothing to hide
- Knowing it is an experiment, some validity is compromised on both sides
- Don't *always* feel super comfortable in conversation; I can be awkward, but the reactions indicate that people felt the conversations were maintained, possibly indicating genuinity of meeting someone before knowing anything.

Error Analysis

- Elliot & Spencer role reversal
- Having the subjects unaware that they are participating in an experiment → More authentic interaction and responses?
- More test subjects → More conclusive analysis
- Randomly select participants...?
- Have Elliot scope their social media too?



Concluding Conjectures

People generally felt more comfortable \bullet conversing with Spencer than Elliot. -Result of an assumed conception of their persona? -Causing uncomfortability in interaction? Or personality type? Tend to believe impressions from social \bullet media to be somewhat accurate, but were always surprised by something. -Impossible to know much from media More difficult to carry out conversation igodolbecause of previous knowledge of Elliot

—Greater implications?
